Horizon is hideously overbright in its current theme (even worse than our original on-prem version for which I opened this feature request) and if you have to look at this all day, it's eye-gouging. I tried to use Dark Reader, but that add-on actually causes our in-house KB articles to never load and lock up the Helpdesk to the point where we have to restart a tab for Horizon from scratch. This behavior is replicated across every browser I use: Brave, Chrome, Edge, and Firefox. For a site to not have a dark theme available in this day and age is rather telling, especially when DeskPro has been around for as long as it has.
